NZART Business Manager Debby ZL2TDM Says:

Insurance details - I am receiving a number of queries regarding the Insurance covers that will be available to Branches. At this stage we are only **negotiating** the possibility of Branch Repeaters and Beacons being covered under the **Public Liability portion of the NZART policy**. It is envisaged further down track to be able to negotiate rates for Branch assets to be incorporated with these same Insurers. This is why I need all Branches to complete the form, which was posted with your recent Branch circular. Not only will it give us information on your beacons and repeaters but will also assist us in the future for asset insurance. The insurance cover we seek is not just for AREC and their exercises.

Branches becoming members - I have been asked to clarify the need for Branches to belong to the Association. I think the need to support the National Association goes without saying. I also believe that by Branches being in receipt of Break In and Call book, spreads the word to all those non-members out there and perhaps will encourage them to join. I also believe that in the future if negotiations go well with Insurers, then only NZART member Branches will be eligible to apply. The cost of Branches joining the Association, is the same as a Transmitting member \$85.00, with a \$10 rebate applicable if paid by 31 October 2001.

Council Comment with Bruce Douglas ZL2WP:

As mentioned in the July/August edition of Break-In "Council Comment will appear regularly in either *Break-In* or HQ-Info-Line.

There are a number of ongoing action points that are being steadily dealt to. Of these one worth a special mention is the preparation for a review of the Question and Answer data base and the Study Guide for the Amateur Radio Examinations having regard to the pending changes to the regulations which are likely to be in place in late September (according to the latest predictions). Fred ZL2AMJ has this well in hand. Other matters include the updating of the Conference A-Z with some input from Whangarei Branch, NZART Strategic Plan deliberations, HQ Procedure Manual, Constitutional matters, Web page developments, Insurance Issues, Conference Remits and CD ROM Project.

Council will hold a Face to Face meeting in Upper Hutt on the weekend of the 9^{th} & 10^{th} February 2002 and a number of issues will be held over until then.

The important roles of ARDF and Fundraising Officers have yet to be filled. Those positions are to be re-advertised in Break-In. If you have the necessary skills to undertake either of these roles please make your interest known.

The usual wide range of reports were received and discussed, these included reports in respect of the Business Management Committee, the QSL Bureau, Stolen Equipment, Examinations, EMC Officer, VHF/UHF/SHF Record, World Wide Web pages and FMTAG. Additionally various information papers were received and noted and July Payments/Receipts & Actuals versus Budget noted and payments approved.

On the International Scene Council was pleased to record its vote in favour of the Pitcairn Island Amateur Radio Association's admission to the IARU. PIARA has 10 members - the entire population of resident amateurs!

Under general business there was some discussion on the promulgation of HQ-Info-Line via Packet Radio. The consensus view of Council was that distribution via E-MAIL and through branches is considered sufficient to advise members. The use of Packet Radio for this purpose was not approved.

It is only possible to give a "once over lightly" in Council Comment but naturally if major events develop these will be emphasised.

Did you know?

That NZART has on two occasions made written and verbal submissions to a Parliamentary Select Committee? In 1989 NZART made written and verbal submissions to the Parliamentary Select Committee dealing with the Radiocommunications Bill. In 1998 NZART made written and verbal submissions to the Parliamentary Select Committee dealing the Radiocommunications Amendment Bill.

At the WARO Annual General Meeting 3 June 2001 the following resolutions were passed:

1. FRIENDS OF WARO

"That a new Clause be added to the Constitution of NZ WARO." "New Clause 7: Friends of WARO:

Persons who support NZ WARO may become 'Friends of WARO' by making a donation of not less than the current subscription. Friends of WARO may receive newsletters and publicity material. Existing Clauses 7 through to 16 now become Clause 8 through to 17."

2. SUBSCRIPTIONS

"That the renewed annual subscriptions are to be \$15.00 discounted to \$10.00 if paid before 31^{st} August, and that new members joining will pay \$10.00 for the first year. Sponsored DX members to remain at \$5.00. The Annual Family subscription \$12.00."

NZART Administration Liaison Officer Fred Johnson ZL2AMJ Reports:

A message just received from the Ministry of Economic Development, Frequency Management Group in response to an enquiry about progress with the New Radio Regulations reads -

"Our best current estimate is late September for the new Regulations (with the sections covering Certificates of Competency) to come into force. This estimate includes the standard 28-day period after the regulations have been approved by Cabinet and the Executive Council before they come into effect.

Because we are effectively amalgamating into one document and simplifying, as far as possible, all three existing sets of regulations that sit under the Radiocommunications Act, as well as ensuring that the new regulations accurately reflect in every respect all of the changes made in the Radiocommunications Amendment Act, the exercise has turned out to be pretty complex. Add to that extensive consultations with our own legal people and the Parliamentary Counsel Office as well as Treasury and Justice, and the difficulty of predicting and keeping to a timetable will be appreciated."

OPERATOR COMMENTS (WHERE INCLUDED WITH THE LOG)

I was determined to operate on eight bands, from Brynderwyn, next to the Telecom microwave site, and was pleased with the results. This Contest turned into a test of endurance, with high winds and heavy rain. Brass Monkey is a very apt name for the Contest. It was very wet under foot, with gum boot-high mud. The car and gear ended up coated in mud. There was no sun, but it was most enjoyable to work our many friends on the Amateur bands.

I operated from adjacent to the ZL1VHF beacon. The noise floor on the band was about S5.

We operated from near the Klondyke repeater site.

And for the nostalgic... I found a 2-metre log from Field Day 1976. It shows a very high level of activity, with over 300 contacts in 12 hours. We were a group from the Radio Depot Auckland. I was only 18 years old then and was keen on contesting and DX. I think I still have that problem. (Congratulations on the results in this contest, and long may your "problem" continue - Contest Manager).
