Remember it has never been easier to subscribe to the Info-Line distribution list and have Info-Line sent to you direct by E-mail. Just check into the NZART web page <a href="https://www.nzart.org.nz">www.nzart.org.nz</a> and look for **Info-Line Subscribe.** Supply your name, callsign and E-mail address and that's all you need to do. You will receive an e-mail confirmation of your auto-subscription and you can un-subscribe at any time.

#### From Rotorua Branch 33 – The Whale Island Expedition:

During November this year (2001), a small number of Branch 33 members are going to Whale Island for a little radio activity. The dates planned for the DX expedition are the 23<sup>rd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> of November with operations on all HF bands to take place over the weekend NZ local time.

Whale or Moutohora Island is a small hilly island rising to 347m, in the Bay of Plenty, 9km off shore from the mouth of the Whakatane River. It should not be confused with the active volcano of White Island its much larger neighbour to the northeast

The New Zealand Department of Conservation presently manages Whale Island and access to the island is very limited with strict controls for any whom may be lucky enough to be allowed a short visit. Being an island of IOTA interest it is hoped that this expedition will generate many contacts for the amateurs who will be participating. The special callsign of ZL6WI is being applied from the MED (NZ's Licensing Bureau) and it is hoped that the IOTA committee would give consideration to a unique reference number. Details will be released as they come to hand.

### Did you know?

That a request was made in 1990 by NZART for access to the LF band 165-190 kHz by New Zealand radio amateurs? This was approved subject to special conditions. You require a special permit from the Ministry of Economic Development, Radio Spectrum Management, if you wish to transmit in this band.

Access to this LF band didn't just happen. NZART works in the interests of all radio amateurs in New Zealand and needs the support of your continuing membership. Suggest to others that they join NZART too.
