The Jock White Memorial Field Day a contest for branch teams. This event is on February 24 and 25 from 0200-1100 and 1700-0200 UTC - that's 3pm midnight Saturday and 6 am to 3 pm Sunday on 80 and 40 metres. WORLD AMATEUR RADIO DAY 2001

The IARU Administrative Council has announced the theme for World Amateur Radio Day 2001: "**Providing Disaster Communications: Amateur Radio in the 21st Century**." Continuing Issues with the Ministry of Economic Development New New Zealand Radio Regulations:

It had been expected that the "New Regs" would be implemented early in 2001. The NZART Administration Liaison Officer has been advised by the Radio Spectrum Management Group of the Ministry of Economic Development that: "The Regulations project is still on track for a potential implementation date of June/July this year. The project also includes a fees review and we hope to release a public discussion paper in that regard within the next fortnight."

We had all been hoping that the NZART CallBook for 2001 would be back to being a complete listing and that other changes to benefit the Amateur Service could be implemented soon too. It seems that we must continue to wait. Watch the MED web page to see what the fee document is all about."
