The New Licensing Arrangements - Earlier editions of HQ-Info-Line and the November/December issue of "Break-In" mention that the new examinations software containing the revised Examination Question-Bank and the revised Study Guide will be available from the NZART web site. All this material is all ready to go but there is now a delay until a new document about the pass-standard measurement method for the 5 word-per-minute Morse test is received from the Ministry. The information from this new document will then be blended into various explanatory files in the material to go on the web site. The document is expected to be received "next week".

W1AW schedules Transatlantic, OSCAR celebrations in December:

The ARRL Maxim Memorial Station W1AW has scheduled two Special Event operations during December.

W1AW will be on the air December 3-7 to honor the 80th anniversary of the 1921 Transatlantic tests. Listen for W1AW/80 on many HF and VHF bands (including satellites).

W1AW also will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the first Amateur Radio satellite—OSCAR I—launched into orbit on December 12, 1961. W1AW will be on the air as W1AW/40 December 10-14 on as many of the active satellites as possible.

A special QSL card will be available for contacts or listener reports on both events. QSL requests for W1AW/80 and W1AW/40 go to W1AW, 225 Main St, Newington, CT 06111. Include a self-addressed, stamped envelope or the appropriate number of IRCs with each request.
