REVIEW OF ANNUAL RADIOCOMMUNICATIONS LICENCE

FEES: A document from MED about a review of licence fees (see HQ Info-Line #2) is now available at the MED site. http://www.med.govt.nz/rsm/DP15.pdf

NZART's Administration Liaison Officer Fred Johnson ZL2AMJ says that the review appears to have little impact on the NZ Radio Amateur - the only major reference is at paragraph 9.15 which says: "9.15 amateur, maritime mobile (ships) and aeronautical mobile (aircraft) stations would continue to be treated as station-based licences in view of the multiplicity of equipment, frequencies and services installed in these stations."

Comment is called for by 16 March, NZART will be responding.

Change of Manager for the ZL3-Prefix QSL Sub-Bureau:

The NZART QSL Bureau Manager Barry Stewart ZL2RR has advised a change of Manager for the ZL3-prefix QSL sub-bureau. Mr E. W. (Bill) Jefferis ZL3DV has been appointed.

All incoming cards for any amateur holding a ZL3 call sign, whether or not a member of NZART, are available from ZL3DV for the price of a Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE)!

To assist Bill in setting up this operation, you are asked to please take out the time to drop him a note and confirm your requirements for the handling of your incoming cards (e.g. frequency of mailing) and to also check on whether or not he has on hand SASEs of yours. The undertaking of this simple request will greatly assist ZL3DV to provide the service from that we expect! Bill has taken receipt of some QSL cards and envelopes from the previous manager, Derek ZL3SL.
