Administration Liaison Officer News with Fred Johnson ZL2AMJ:

A letter from the Ministry of Economic Development advises that the Radio Spectrum Management Group is undergoing review and the "scope of this review is focused on the Ministry's internal processes and structure with a view to enhancing our service delivery in terms of innovation, cost-effectiveness and simplicity". Apparently the draft review proposes a severe reduction in staff numbers but no figures are given. It seems that many regional offices will close and regionally-based licensing is to cease, so it is expected that candidates passing the Amateur Radio Exam outside the main centres will be inconvenienced. The possibility of added delays to amateur radio matters due to decreased staff is of concern. More when more is known.

National System 2002 Award Update:

With the publication of the 2002-2003 Callbook, the number of possible Branches that qualify for inclusion in the award has reduced to just 75, making the achievement of the previously announced 75 Award a tough proposition.

Wellington VHF Group, sponsor of the award, have decided that in addition to the pinnacle 75 Award, they will now also award certificates for achievement of 70 to 74 branches.

Award Custodian, Dick ZL2TGQ said, "Whilst we want to encourage applicants to continue to strive for the 75 Award, we appreciate how much more difficult this is now, and we want to also recognise the efforts of those who exceed 70 Branches but who don't quite make the 75 target".
