About the "40-metre band" and WRC-2003? The importance of this matter to radio amateurs will be understood, but the complexities and the difficulties are less well known.

Starting on 26 August, in South Korea, the APT (Asia-Pacific Telecommunity) is meeting in preparation for the WRC-2003 (in June, in Geneva). This APT meeting, known as APG-4, is the 4th in a series of APT Preparatory Group meetings. New Zealand is a member of APT and a delegation will be present. IARU will be represented.

The major amateur issues are Agenda items 1.7 and 1.23. Other items with some influence on amateur radio are 1.2, 1.36, and 1.38.

Look for the countries that show support for re-alignment at 7 MHz (Agenda Item 1.23). Difficult? Yes! The Chairman's meeting report should appear at this website in due time too.

Will 40 metres become free of broadcast stations? We're working on it and we need your support.
