### Fred ZL2AMJ to go to Tokyo meeting

Council has approved travel for Fred Johnson ZL2AMJ to attend the Asia-Pacific Telecommunity Preparatory Group meeting (APG2003-5) in Tokyo on  $19^{th} - 25^{th}$  February. The important issue is the re-alignment of the bands at 7MHz that will be discussed again at the World Radiocommunications Conference WRC2003 in June in Geneva. The objective is to gain wider support from Region 3 administrations for the re-alignment of the broadcast and amateur bands at 7 MHz.

Although Fred is a member of the NZ Delegation, the Ministry of Economic Development cannot, unfortunately, provide financial support. To those of you who feel they are unable to continue your membership with the Association, I would urge you to reconsider. Fred among many is an Officer of the Association who gives voluntarily of his time and in many cases funds in order that you are well represented in these vital issues.

#### **Council Meet in February**

Council will be holding a face to face meeting over the 15/16 February in Upper Hutt. This is a good opportunity if you have concerns for Council to discuss and resolve them where possible. If you do wish to contribute to the meeting, please send me your concerns/ideas by 31 January, in order for me to include it in the agenda.

I am pleased to report that there will be an election in the Northern Region, i.e. from Central North Island to the North Cape.
