MED Request - All amateurs should be made aware that life-time licences will be introduced some time this year. However for those of you considering not renewing or have not renewed your annual license because of this, please think again. If your licence is not current at the time of introducing the 'life-time licence', it will cost you more to set it up anew. You may also run the risk of your call sign not being available as it may have been reissued to another amateur.



NEW ZEALAND 100 MHz H.F. AWARD (2003):

This award is open to all licensed radio amateurs.

The object is to promote amateur activity on the various H.F. frequencies used within New Zealand.

To qualify for the award licensed amateurs are required to work such a number of New Zealand base stations on the HF frequencies (160m -10m) to make up a total of at least 100 MHz (100 points) and not more than 107.5 MHz, (107.5 points). All contacts must be made between March the 1st and December 31st 2003.
