Courtesy of Baz ZL1DD here are the results of STRAIGHT KEY NIGHT 2003

Although the SKN 2003 clashed with the All Blacks vs Wales game there were 27 logs from ZL and 2 from VK. A major solar flare did not affect conditions unduly and QRN levels were down here, but heavy in VK. Reasonable conditions mean the QRP boys do well, but sooner or later the higher power stations will have their day.

A very interesting collection of radios and equally interesting personalities participated in the event. First overall and top of the vintage QRP division was octogenarian Jack ZL1AJ with ARC5 tx at 5 watts and AR88 receiver. Baz ZL1DD's ZC1Mk2 clanked its way to second place. Both ZL1AN and ZL1DD had the same number of contacts but one point was deducted from Baz's score as his log was not as clean as Jack's. Hot on their tail was Tom ZL1WW with his ZC1Mk1, third overall and third vintage QRP. How many will join the ZC1 Challenge next year?

Ron ZL1TW used the K2 magic to make the largest number of contacts, taking the Open QRP division and fourth overall. Second Open QRP: John ZL1ALZ, while Jumbo ZL1HV with two watts from his Argonaut at ninety plus years of age came third in open QRP. QRPP star was Bruce ZL1WB with but one watt from his homebrew transmitter, and a different key used for each QSO!

First in the Open class Roger ZL2RX used an FT101 (almost vintage nowadays) as did Jakey ZL2JKY (better known as G3JKY) who was second. First and only operator in the Vintage Open section was Peter ZL2JJ with his elegant home made key, TRF regen rx and 807 tx. Tony ZL2ALJ batted away with a home made WOODEN key, with the bark still on some of it. True! 2003 saw our first YL entrant, Carolyn ZL2JP. Looking forward to seeing you next year, Carolyn. Bill ZL3NB was the lone ZL3 representative, and where are you, ZL4? We miss you! If there were consolation prizes to be handed out my nominations would be: Ken ZL1AIH, out after the first hour with a glass arm brought about by too much rotary hoeing during the day and ZL1AMN RFI'd out after only four contacts.

Special praise for the VK boys, John VK5NJ doing a great job with QRP, and Les VK4BUI who battled QRN at his end, but had a booming signal here. Vintage gear and vintage operators starred this year. Phil ZL2RVW a mere stripling of 40 years seems to have been the youngest operator in the event.
