IARU presents an Amateur Radio Administration Course in Iran:

In response to an invitation from the administration of the Islamic Republic of Iran, Fred Johnson ZL2AMJ representing the IARU Region 3 and Daniel Lamoureux VE2KA representing the IARU International Secretariat visited Iran to present a three-day Amateur Radio Administration Course, 26 to 28 April 2004.

Since the early 1980s this course has been conducted by IARU in various forms in countries all over the world and in response to invitations from administrations to train regulators and prospective regulators in the administering of the amateur service and amateur satellite service. Related objectives include managing disaster relief communications and organising an amateur radio society.

The course in Tehran was arranged by Mr T. Shafiee and Mr M. Zomorodi of the Directorate General of Telecommunications. An excellent training room was provided with full support facilities including a data projector and access to a photocopier. The course was presented using PowerPoint displays prepared by IARU and each of the 16 participants received printed copies of the displays and many other documents and two CD-ROMs with documentation about amateur radio.

The two IARU visitors had discussions with many radio amateurs in Tehran, some of whom attended the course. The course participants visited EP3PTT, a station established in the Ministry's office premises in Tehran. The equipment in this station was received by Iran from the IARU Region 3 Stars*** programme. Licensed Iranian operators may operate it by arrangement.

There have been amateur radio societies in Iran in earlier years but there has not been an IARU member society. An amateur radio "club", a social meeting group, presently meets in Tehran.

The course has been a memorable experience for the two IARU visitors who have been very warmly received. Contact between IARU and the amateurs and the administration of Iran is to continue and further amateur radio information is to be provided.

Please send your response, as soon as possible, by mail or e-mail, to the addresses at the bottom of this column, to help us ensure that this Call Book is the most accurate ever.

RE-PLANNING THE NATIONAL SYSTEM – PROGRESS REPORT

There are two proposals:

- 1. Move the existing stations up the band, by "about 900 kHz".
- 2. Move the existing stations up the band, by "about 900 kHz", and invert the transmit/receive sense of all the stations.

Evaluation of Proposal 1 has been completed. Proposal 1 is viable, from a frequency planning perspective, and can proceed after consultation with NZART members and MED licensing action.

Evaluation of Proposal 2 is under way. Proposal 2 has some impact on "local" 2 metre and 70 cm repeaters, requiring many of them to change frequency.

FMTAG is also investigating alternative paths in Northland, to solve the long-standing problems caused by path overshoot and distant-site intermodulation.

A National System Forum is planned for NZART Conference in Blenheim. It is hoped that as many of the Trustees, as is possible, will attend Conference, or will brief their Branch delegates accordingly.

INTERIM RECOMMENDATIONS TO COUNCIL - None this month.

FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS TO COUNCIL - Branch 65 Papakura has applied for coordination of a Voice-Over-Internet system. The main station will be a 2 metre repeater at Quarry Road, Ardmore, at NZ260 map reference R12 892577. We have selected 545 as being the most appropriate, corresponding to a repeater transmit frequency of 145.450 MHz and a repeater receive frequency of 144.850 MHz. The corresponding Internet access station will be located at the Branch 65 clubrooms, at NZ260 map reference R12 812590. The Quarry Road station will be linked to the clubrooms by means of a duplex 70 cm link. We have selected 438.000 MHz for the Quarry Road transmit frequency, and 433.000 MHz for the Branch 65 clubrooms transmit frequency, as being the most appropriate.

Branch 85 Mercury Bay has applied to move the 7075 repeater, by a distance of less than 3 km, to Kakaratahei, at NZ260 map reference T11 385754. Engineering analysis confirms that this repeater can continue to operate on the existing channel 7075, corresponding to a repeater transmit frequency of 147.075 MHz and a repeater receive frequency of 147.675 MHz.

Branch 86, the Suburban Amateur Radio Club, has applied for a duplex 70 cm link between Ponga Hill, Papakura, at NZ260 map reference R12 886529, and Musick Point, at NZ260 map reference R11 800818. We have selected 438.125 MHz for the Ponga Hill transmit frequency, and 433.125 MHz for the Musick Point transmit frequency, as being the most appropriate.
