80th Anniversary of Milestone QSO:

The first ever two-way radio communication between New Zealand and England was made on the 18th of October 1924 by Frank Bell of Shag Valley Station, Otago. Frank Bell held the callsign Z4AA and on that date 18th October 1924, using primitive homebrew radio equipment, he made contact with Cecil Goyder, G2SZ at the Mill Hill school in London. The CW QSO lasted for about 1 hour and dealt mainly with issues concerning signal quality. For several nights after the historic contact they kept in touch.

Contests with Stan White ZL2ST:

The big worldwide contest of the year - the CQ Worldwide SSB Contest is on the weekend of October 30/31. It runs from 0000 Saturday (1 pm NZT) to 2400 Sunday (1 pm Monday). Exchange report + CQ Zone (32 for NZ).

The NZART Straight Key Night is coming up on Sunday November 7 between 0700 and 1000 UTC (2000-2300 NZ time) on 80 metres. Straight keys only in four divisions: Vintage QRP, Vintage QRO, Open QRP, Open QRO. Exchange: RST/ QTH/ operator's name (one word)/key used/ TX type/ TX power (watts). Results of the Doug Gorman Memorial Frequency Measuring Contest 2004

It was great to see 23 entries after hearing reports that some would-be entrants were unable to get three good readings because of either QRM or QRN. A three-way tie for first in the Norm Edwards Shield doesn't happen very often.

This year, a small difference was made to the way results were calculated. The calculations were based on the entrants submitted numbers, rather than as had been done in the past where the entrant's results were rounded to whole numbers of Hertz before calculations commenced. This change was made after it had been pointed out that our pre-rounding had altered the integrity of some of the final numbers.

We are thinking of making other small changes to the method of running the contest. This is so that contestants will have a better idea of when and where we are likely to be, in case they lose us at any

stage. A questionnaire will be sent to this year's contestants. Whether we do make any changes will depend on a consensus of replies received.
