The New Plymouth Amateur Radio Club invites all members of N.Z.A.R.T. To the New Plymouth Wind-Wand Symposium 2005. This includes the N.Z.A.R.T. Annual General Meeting to be held on Saturday 4th June.

 Venue: The Quality Hotel Plymouth International Courtenay Street New Plymouth Phone 0800.800.597
Date: 4-5-6 June 2005, Queens Birthday weekend

Accommodation: The Quality Hotel Plymouth International is the booking agent for the venue and they have a variety of rooms available at the above premises and the Auto Lodge. If you want to stay at a motor camp or somewhere else please feel free to make your own bookings. When booking please state that you are attending the

NZART Wind-Wand Symposium.

Transport: Please indicate on the Registration form if you need to be met at the Airport. The maximum shuttle fare will be \$15 per person but this could be reduced depending on numbers, flights, etc.

Talk in Station: ZL2AB will be operating on both repeaters 720 and 705, and the National System.

Symposium Registrations: will be at the Quality Hotel Plymouth International at 5.30pm on Friday 3 June in the Hotel Foyer. Closing at 9pm and re-opening at 7.30am on Saturday 4 June. The Registration area will be open during the Symposium to assist you with any requests. There will be an informal gathering on Friday evening after registration. Opening of Symposium will be at 9am Saturday with local dignitaries in attendance.

The AGM will commence at 9.30am chaired by President Peter Norden ZL2SJ. This meeting will finish at approximately 3pm. Afternoon tea to follow. Richard Rowntree will conduct the **forum session** until 5 pm. The Annual Dinner will commence at 6.30pm for drinks with the meal at 7.30pm.

Forums will recommence at 8.45am Sunday these will be AREC, (at TEMO) OTC, SPAM, WARO, AMSAT, VHF. Contests, ARPS, Digital Modes etc.

Mobile Rally is due to commence 1pm Sunday 5th (see Registration Form). Tarry ZL2KV & Frank ZL2BR will be convening this. There will be some differences this time with a Hidden Transmitter Hunt (2 metres) incorporated during the Rally, any HF or VHF frequencies can be used. There is also a section for valve AM rigs prior to 1960 manufacture or design. All road rules must be obeyed and Radio Regulations complied with. **Alternative Program:** On Saturday a bus will leave the venue at 9.30am and head to Puke Ariki Museum/Centre City shopping complex. Lunch will be at Oakura followed by a visit to Coastal Arts and Crafts trail, returning in time for the Saturday night activities.

On Sunday a bus will leave the venue at 9.30am for Kiln Creations (paint your very own design on a plate, cup or dish). Lunch is provided in the Bell Block area. At 2pm the bus will return to a private movie theatre returning in time for the Sunday night entertainment.

Car boot Sale: For anyone interested in selling or buying equipment, we intend to have a car boot sale in the hotel car park on Sunday at lunchtime. There will be no commission or space charges. Disclaimer: the N.P.A.R.C. has no responsibility for any transactions.
