New Amateurs may apply on line also, however as the Certificate must be sited before a license can be issued, it is advisable that they complete the new Radio 1 Application and forward to the Ministry with their certificate.

(Please note there is a transpositional error in the "Costs" column of the Registration form on page 27 of Break-In. The B2 Alternative Programme cost should read \$45 and B3 the NZART AGM should read "Free".)

The Canterbury Convention 2006 Award - The Ministry of Commerce has granted the committee permission to use the callsign ZL6CAN.

1. The award shall be run from 22nd April to 4th June 2006 inclusive. The award is available to all Amateur and Shortwave Listeners.

QSO's may be made on any band or mode. Each station shall only be contacted once for scoring purposes, for each application for the Award.

2. New Zealand stations require 25 points from the list shown below: - A compulsory contact with the Special Event station: - ZL6CAN - 5 points

Canterbury Club stations of NZART (Inc.): -

Christchurch Amateur Radio Club;
Ashburton Branch;
O5 ZL3AC - 4 points
O1 ZL3AF - 4 points

3. Overseas stations require only six points, calculated as above with no compulsory contact required.

The fee covers certificate and return postage.

In New Zealand this is set at \$5.00

For Overseas award applications, the equivalent of A\$5.00, US\$5.00 or equivalent, or 5 IRC's, but no stamps please.

General conditions:

The Canterbury Province of New Zealand has four branches and Cards who attend the Combined Branches Meetings, and for special events we traditionally include Ashburton Branch. A roster system will be operating for the ZL6CAN callsign. VHF and UHF repeater frequencies may be used with discretion, but observe rules pertaining to their function. Look for Branch and Canterbury callsigns on the HF bands and also the Awards Net on 3.677 MHz from 8 pm each night.

Amateur the Year Award:

Presented at NZART Annual Conference, this award is made to the radio amateur who in the preceding 12 months (calendar year January to December) has given outstanding service to Amateur Radio.

1. Criteria.

- (a) Nominees must be active in more than one aspect of amateur radio and in these to have shown extraordinary service to their fellow amateurs.
- (b) The nominee must be a current member of NZART Inc.
- (c) The nominee should be unaware of the nominations.

2. Nominations.

- (a) Nominations to be made to the President of NZART (at current address) to reach the President by May 1st following the year under review.
- (b) Nominations must be made through the Secretary of a Branch of NZART Inc.
- c) Points of "service rendered" must be tabulated and certified as correct by the Branch Chairman (except that two other officers would be accepted if the circumstances warrant) and these must refer only to the 12 month period under review. Through these, the reason why the nominee should be considered must be clearly evident.

The President will decide on the Award allocation reporting the result to Council immediately prior to the Annual General Meeting. It is possible that in some years no award would be made even though recommendations were received.
