The NZART Business Manager Debby ZL2TDM Says

Survey Results: There have been a number of questions and concerns raised regarding the figures I quoted on the Official Broadcast last weekend for the results of the Repeaters Beacons and Fixed Links. (Among other things!)

There were a total of 144 votes presented. Eight of which were sent in by Branches, these counted as one vote per branch. Council approved this method of counting, as it was difficult to determine members present at the Branch meeting where the vote was taken. I did request that where Branch votes were submitted to please advise who was present in order to reduce duplication of votes, in case a member chose to vote individually also, however did not receive any response.

All 8 Branches who returned a vote chose Option 1. Taking Branch membership figures into account, the total number of members' votes would have increased the final result to 387. Therefore the correct result would be as follows:

The survey has now closed, so please do not send any further votes to me. Council needed to make a decision before the 2nd of November, and have time to discuss before the payment was due. (See also *Repeater Survey Results (from NZART Council)*)

SMART System and Call Sign Allocation: We are now in the final stages for implementing the SMART system with NZART which will become the location for Official Call Sign issuance.

The Radio Spectrum Group have included the following press release on their web site and asked that I pass on to you all.

"Online applications for licences that include the allocation of a call sign have been suspended until 21-Nov-2006 due to impending software changes. The affected licence types in SMART are:

Amateur/Operator/Amateur General

This is to provide for future access by Approved Radio Examiners to issue call signs and certificates online for the above licence types.

Paper-based applications will be accepted in the interim, but will not be processed until the above changes are implemented in SMART"

Could all examiners please advise your candidates, that if they are wanting a new certificate, these will not be issued until after the 21st of November, so where possible, please hold off making application for a call sign.

Repeater Survey Results (from NZART Council)

Last month Council ran a survey for NZART members to gain their thoughts on options for Licensing Repeaters.

Council received 144 replies. These replies included replies from 8 Branches.

Option 1 asked whether NZART should pay for all beacon, repeater and fixed link licenses for this period only (2006 - 7).

99 votes were recorded for this option. This included 7 of the 8 branches who sent votes in and accounted for 69% of replies.

Option 2 asked whether NZART should decline to pay for any beacon, repeater and fixed link license fees, without exception.

5 votes were recorded for this option. This accounted for 3% of replies.

Option 3 asked whether NZART should pay for certain beacon, repeater and fixed link license fees for 2006 – 2007 and maybe beyond.

40 votes were recorded for this option. This included 1 of the 8 branches who sent votes in and accounted for 28% of replies.

Option 1 came out the clear winner. A question has been asked as to whether the Branch Votes should have been recorded as one vote or one vote per member. The fact that 7 of the 8 branches who voted recorded votes for the winning option only reenforces that option, and therefore making Option 1 the clear winner by a larger margin.
