Comet Hunting is Like the Elusive DX Country

The bands are quiet for some, so an alternative to early morning grey band QSOs had an amateur on the track up to a local high point, before dawn, to see the early morning sun rise and its current comet. Arriving at the destination saw the sky covered with cloud so no comet this morning. Another morning, another try.

The story continues:

"After studying maps, reading the morning paper, checking out the Internet etc, I expected that a horizon view over the sea to be a better bet.

So at 8.30 pm we left, the cloud cover of the sky didn't bode well for comet spotting, nevertheless we continued on to our designated spot.

We were not the only ones comet spotting; about 5 other cars were parked on the grass verge, looking out to sea, so we joined up. It was 9.05 pm and the sun had not set, a bit cloudy at the horizon still, so we waited, and waited and waited, the sun dipped below the horizon, it was a very pink sky, still quite light, and one could detect the mountains of the South Island in the distance. And still we waited, it was then 9.35 pm.

All the others parked by us had packed up and left and I said if there is no show, we will go at 10.00 pm (having been up at 4.30 am for my first attempt at comet spotting I was a little tired).

There were 2 stars in the sky, no where near where Jupiter was supposed to be (it's a guide to locate the comet), so I got out of the car, to stretch my legs and lo and behold there it was. Quite high up, I reckon about 20 25 degrees above the horizon, and about 5 degrees to the left of where the sun had set. It was quite faint as I had to have my glasses on to see it, but through the binoculars it was fantastic.

A bright spot at the tip, and then the tail quite remarkable, it was very long so it seemed. We were both quite pleased so we stayed for 10-15 minutes looking at it trying to take a picture, but it was to faint to show up.

So having been comet spotting at night we headed home through a small town where there was quite a crowd all looking to the sky. It was very bright and the tail was magnificent. The complete comet followed us to almost home, then it faded into just the tail."

Here is a message from Bob Whelan (former President of RSGB and successful Commonwealth Contest participant) to ZL's giving hints and suggestions so as to enhance the ZL Team's scoring opportunities in the upcoming RSGB Commonwealth Contest Team's Event. Bob will be a member of the ZL Team operating from the Cook Islands (E5):

Yes the bonus points mean that every ZL pretty well, can help our score by working any other ZL call area in our team. So if you can suggest/cajole/threaten/bribe casual ZL ops to at least give the teams a few Qs then they will have done us a big service. I want to try and understand what you think would be the best strategy for me to follow, clearly I want to work the whole ZL team on as many bands as possible, whether that will include 10m I don't know - but it might and if so when ?. I guess from your current experience of band conditions that only 80/40 are likely to be open at the start of BERU.

Anyway can we share some thoughts on these matters.

I had a look at other Commonwealth DXpeds at the same time and there is one due to start from 9M0, one from 9M6, ZS3 (polar path?), ZF? J6 or 8 but not too much else.

I should add that the other interesting team 'DX-exotica' captained by Dave J8? has been recruiting all over the place so when we know its members in a few weeks time that should provide some more to go after. I will post this on the website if I get it before we leave here on the 16th Feb.
