# The NZART Business Manager Debby ZL2TDM says:

# **EXAMINATIONS AND FEES**

There appears to be considerable confusion over what must be forwarded to me. On completion of a successful examination, please complete a Candidates record form, a Blue ERN form and have the candidate complete a Radio 4A application form with a choice of 3 possible call signs. The cost of an examination is \$15, \$5 of that can be kept by the Branch to cover costs.

A further \$50 is required for all new Call sign application's this will entitle the new amateur to a call sign of their choice, if available, and a Certificate of Competency. There are no further fees payable, unless the candidate wishes to join NZART. If this is the case contact me and I will give you details.

I must sight the Blue Examination Result Notification, before I can process an application for a call sign. This is the candidates Official record of having passed, therefore must be completed correctly and clearly.

If you are in doubt, please call me prior to completing an exam.

Furthermore, while it is slightly off the subject, many of you will be aware of the new Amateur Radio Brochure that has been produced.

This brochure states there are no fees payable, which is or isn't correct, depending on your interpretation.

By fees payable, historically this meant an annual license fee - there is a misconception that this is still required. The answer is NO it isn't

If the person is an existing member of NZART, then the fee is \$30 for the application of a call sign and certificate. The examination fee of \$15 still applies.

The application fee to pass an exam and apply for a call sign and certificate is a one off only fee. I would hope that should a person query you regarding getting their "license", that you can explain the difference - the amount payable is for processing purposes only - unfortunately my time and costs involved must be charged, otherwise members would have to cover costs of this service also.

We have waited a long time to get some form of advertising material, and we finally have one, that is not too wordy and in modern format. Please use it and advise people accordingly. If you want copies of this brochure for your Branch please let me know.

# **100 Basic Electronic Projects - on CD-ROM**

The booklet 100 Basic Electronic Projects was produced by the New South Wales Division of the Wireless Institute of Australia in 1982. It has been copied to CD-ROM on behalf of the NZART Radioscience Education Trust with the kind permission of Wireless Institute of Australia New South Wales.

Surprisingly, it is still very current with lots of simple projects and clear explanations about how they work. It should be a source of inspiration for budding scientists and engineers.

It should energise youngsters towards thinking about radio and radio topics. Even if they never build anything, just looking at the circuits and their applications could bring on ideas! The projects can be examined on-screen and those selected for closer interest can be printed off by a right click of the mouse then another click to print picture. Simple!

The book, all 114 pages, appears on-screen exactly as it does on paper. It is purposeful without needing any fancy updating or modernising. The circuits are very simple, the diagrams clear, the go-first-time factor will be high, costs low, all components are substitute-able.

A four-page booklet can be printed from the CD describing how to make your own Electronic Test Bench. Any youngster can build one and then fabricate selections from these 100 circuits. Standard components are used and these are many-times re-usable.

A CD will be posted to you on application to NZART HQ, a donation of \$5 or more to the NZART

Radioscience Education Trust is appreciated. The Trustees are grateful for the donations already received This CD can be freely copied. Branches could donate umpteen copies of the CD to local schools as an Amateur Radio promotion to encourage youngsters towards an interest in radio and electronics. Bags of common-value components could be assembled as give-away starter packs for the electronics test bench to encourage those who show interest. **Every kid in the country needs one!**

### Blue Moon in July

When you hear someone say "Once in a Blue Moon..." you know what they mean: Rare. Seldom. Maybe even absurd. After all, when was the last time you saw the moon turn blue?

According to modern folklore, a Blue Moon is the second full moon in a calendar month. Usually months have only one full moon, but occasionally a second one sneaks in. Full moons are separated by 29 days, while most months are 30 or 31 days long; so it is possible to fit two full moons in a single month. This happens every two and a half years, on average.

July has the first full moon on July 2nd and a second on July 31st, which is, by definition, a Blue Moon.

A simple test conducted by a ham radio operator in Manassas, Virginia, USA has provided proof positive that even flea-power Q-R-P ham radio operations can shut down Broadband Over Powerline Internet access operation.
