Boat Anchor Sprint Rules and Operating Time

This is in two sections:

Section 1: Old radios - all valves - i.e. ZC1, 19 set, Heathkits, any home brew set, but must have all valves. Section 2: Any Hybrid transceiver (must have valve finals i.e. FT200, FTDX400/401, Drake, FT 101s, etc...

Amplitude Modulated signals only.

The overall winner shall be the entrant having the highest points score which will be published in the following Break-In.

WHEN: The second Saturday each (2007) February, April, June (9), August (11), October (13).

One operating period Local ZL time: 2000 to 2100 hrs

Jumbo "ZL1HV" Award

Presented at NZART Annual Conference

The purpose of this award is to remember one of New Zealand's most well known radio amateurs, who fully supported NZART Inc and branch level activities, in the belief that strong branches meant a strong national organisation.

As there was/is a gap in this area of recognising branch level activities at a national level, this award has be instituted to not so much reward those who work at this most important level but to acknowledge to the rest of the amateur service the tireless work put in at the grass roots of amateur radio.

The Award to be made to the radio amateur or non-transmitting branch member who in the opinion of the

nominator(s) has given outstanding service to Amateur Radio at a branch level over a period of time that has not been recognized anywhere else.

1. Criteria.

- (a) Nominees must be active in branch level activities and in these to have shown extraordinary service to their fellow branch members. Points of service rendered need to be presented to ensure that the nominee meets the purpose and vision of the award as outlined in the introduction.
- (b) The award is for the years prior to the award presentation. E.g. if award year is 2008, the period of time to be considered are those prior to 31 December 2007.
- (c) There are no limits on the number of nominees, however up to a maximum of three recipients can be awarded in any one year.
- (d) The nominee must be a current member of NZART Inc.
- (e) The nominee must be a current member of the nominating branch.
- (f) The nominee should be unaware of the nominations.

2. Nominations.

- (a) Nominations to be made to the General Secretary of NZART (at current address) to reach the office by 1 May following the year(s) under review.
- (b) Nominations must be made through the Secretary of a Branch of NZART Inc.
- (c) Points of "service rendered" must be tabulated and certified as correct by the

Branch Chairman (except that two other officers would be accepted if the circumstances warrant) and these must refer to the period under review. Through these, the reason why the nominee should be considered must be clearly evident.

The General Secretary will recommend those that meet the criteria of the Award to NZART Council for confirmation immediately prior to the Annual General Meeting. It is possible that in some years no award would be made even though nominations/recommendations were received.

The toothbrush with 'satnav'.

As you clean your teeth, Oral-B's Triumph SmartGuide toothbrush transmits its exact location to a base unit. The unit then shows you on an LCD screen which area of your mouth has been cleaned and a clock tells you how long you have left to brush. The system uses technology similar to the Bluetooth system used with hands-free earpieces for mobile phones. The LCD display can be mounted on the bathroom mirror or held in your free hand, picking up information as you brush. The remote display also doubles up as a bathroom clock. Oral-B is hoping that the brush will be a stocking filler this Christmas and has planned its launch in Britain within weeks. == 1296 MHz WAS #1 AWARDED TO TEXAS HAM

Al Ward, W5LUA, of Allen, Texas, is the first person to achieve the ARRL's Worked All States (WAS) on 1296 MHz, making him 1296 MHz WAS #1.

Ward first started on his pursuit January 25, 1977, with his first 1296 MHz contact with Leroy May, W5HN (SK). His 30 year quest ended last week, with confirmed contacts with Wyoming, Utah and Idaho, giving Ward his last three needed states, thanks to Paul Perryman's, WA5WCP, EME DXpedition...
