Report: NZART and MED Meeting

Date: Wednesday 12 December 2007

Time: 2.30 pm

Attendees: Bruce Douglas ZL2WP (NZART), Mark Gooding ZL2UFI (NZART), Don Wallace ZL2TLL (NZART

- ALO), and Wayne Wedderspoon (MED).

Location: MED Building 33 Bowen Street, Wellington

Purpose of Meeting-Introducing ZL2TLL NZART ALO

The primary purpose of the meeting was for the two out-going ALO's (Bruce Douglas and Mark Gooding) to formally introduce Don to the MED as NZART's new Administration Liaison Officer (ALO).

For the benefit of Don, Wayne went through the structure of MED, how it works, the various groups, and how each interacts with the others. It was agreed that it would be appropriate for the MED to add Don to the Radio Sector Group.

In addition to the above, the following items were discussed:

Fees Review

A discussion was held on the Fee's Review, on how the fee's are made up, how they are derived from funding, who pays for what and how the fee's ended up where they are today. This discussion was more of background information for Don, and as mentioned in the Minister's release, a further review of the amateur fees is to take place in 2008.

Some discussion was had on the use of the term "the public good" as outlined in the submission that NZART made on the 2007 Fee's Review.

Reduced Licence Fees

The option for NZART to obtain a further 10% reduction in the licence fees by availing itself of the Licensee Interference Investigation (LII) Option was discussed. This option is discussed in the release of the Fee's Review for 2007 on the MED: RSM site. (see link below)

NZART may wish to avail itself of this option - no decision was made on this at the meeting.

Single Letter Callsigns

The matter of Single Letter Callsigns was discussed and particular note of Public Information Brochures (PIB) 46 - Edition 004 - Part B -Amateur - 3. Temporary Callsigns (Special Events) was referred to. Don is currently seeking input from amateurs on changing the allocation of these callsigns, to match against

the requirements of contesters, DX'ers and other interested groups. It is expected that once Don has compiled the submissions on this, that a suitable outcome will be forthcoming.

MED grants the All New Zealand STSP licence

I have received an email from the MED (Ministry of Economical Development) advising of the granting of Licence 209732 for STSP (Short Term Special Purpose).

The conditions of the licence are:

- 1. Short-Term Special-Purpose (STSP) repeaters must not cause interference to other licensed services.
- 2. Only STSP repeaters are permitted under this licence.
- 3. The maximum permitted operating duration is 14 days.
- 4. The minimum inter-antenna spacing, between the antenna of the STSP and the antenna of any other communication service, is 50 metres.
- 5. Maximum permitted e.i.r.p. +17 dBW.
- 6. Five specified transmit frequencies in the 2 metre band:

146.675 MHz, 146.725 MHz, 146.825 MHz, 146.875 MHz, 146.925 MHz

7. Five specified transmit frequencies in the 70 cm band:

438.625 MHz, 438.675 MHz, 438.725 MHz, 438.750 MHz, 438.775 MHz

ZM6JAM International Scout Jamboree

18th New Zealand/International 2007/2008 Scouts Jamboree

To be held in Christchurch, New Zealand from December 29, 2007 to January 5, 2008.

Over 4,500 Scouts along with 1,000 plus Scout Leaders and support personnel from 14 Countries will participate in this event.

Amateur Radio will be there too with volunteers from local Radio Clubs headed by Paul ZL3TX who will have a fully operational HF/VHF/UHF station running under the Callsign ZM6JAM (OC-134).

The main activity will take place between the hours of 2000Z to 0800Z (9AM to 9PM NZDT) each day apart from New Years Eve when the station will remain active till 1200Z (1AM NZDT). Remember though that NZ is 13 hours ahead of UTC time and one of the first countries in the world to see in the New Year!

ZM6JAM will be active on 80 through 10 meters mainly SSB/Digital Modes along with Echolink via the ZL3CAR repeater Node 101553 and IRLP on 145.625 repeater Node 6900.
