FMTAG NOTES FOR APRIL 2008

NZART Council approved publication of these notes at its April 2008 meeting, for the information of, and seeking comments from, NZART members.

D-STAR (AND SIMILAR DIGITAL MODES)

D-Star is a digital transmission mode for voice and data, developed by the Japan Amateur Radio League (JARL). Complete D-Star equipment, and the UT-118 adaptor module (38 mm x 30 mm) for existing equipment, are currently available for the following D-Star modes:

DV mode (digital voice and low speed data), having an RF occupied bandwidth of about 6 kHz.

DD mode (digital data, which can include embedded digital voice), having an RF occupied bandwidth of about 150 kHz.

Several other digital modes are under development, with similar, or wider, RF bandwidths. The narrowband modes have RF bandwidths of, up to, 16 kHz; the wider modes, for use above 1240 MHz, have RF bandwidths of, up to, 250 kHz.

Digital transmissions are noise-like when received on conventional receivers. Many conventional receivers produce open-mute, full amplitude, noise, depending on the design of the receiver's mute detector, when tuned to a digital transmission. This means that digital transmissions should not be allocated the same frequencies as conventional transmissions, as they could cause much annoyance during band openings.

The DD mode is also used for local and intermediate-distance linking. Backbone linking, having an RF occupied bandwidth of about 10 MHz, is also being developed in some countries.

These digital modes are not currently included in the published NZART Bandplan. Please see the proposed modifications to the Bandplan, in the Interim Recommendations, below.

INTERIM RECOMMENDATIONS TO NZART COUNCIL

Branch 06 Tararua has applied to increase the power of its Wharite 665 repeater, located at map reference NZ260 T23 529016. The repeater transmit frequency is unchanged at 146.650 MHz and the receive frequency is unchanged at 146.050 MHz. An engineering evaluation, in accordance with MED publication PIB38, confirms that there will be no interference to other stations.

D-STAR (AND SIMILAR DIGITAL MODES) SIMPLEX

It is proposed to modify the table at the bottom of Page 4-12 of the 2007-2008 Call Book by adding the following:

144.550 MHz narrow digital mode simplex of up to 16 kHz RF bandwidth.

432.550 MHz narrow digital mode simplex of up to 16 kHz RF bandwidth.

1296.550 MHz narrow digital mode simplex of up to 16 kHz RF bandwidth.

F+0.550 narrow digital mode simplex of up to 16 kHz RF bandwidth.

1294.125 MHz wide digital mode simplex of up to 250 kHz RF bandwidth.

D-STAR (AND SIMILAR DIGITAL MODE) REPEATERS

Narrow mode (such as, but not limited to, D-Star DV mode) repeaters can be accommodated within the existing narrowband FM (NBFM) repeater band segments, provided that the particular channels are not shared with NBFM repeaters. The input and output frequencies will usually be site-specific, chosen during engineering compatibility certification, as described in MED publication PIB38 (available on the MED web site).

Wide mode (such as, but not limited to, D-Star DD mode) repeaters (which occupy the equivalent of ten contiguous NBFM repeater channels) can be accommodated in the 23 cm band within the existing repeater segment, provided that the particular channels are not shared with NBFM repeaters. The input and output frequencies will usually be site-specific.

D-STAR (AND SIMILAR DIGITAL MODE) LINKING

Wide mode (such as, but not limited to D-Star DD mode) linking, and wider bandwidth linking, can be accommodated in the 3 cm band.

It is proposed to modify the bar-graph part way down the right-hand column of Page 3-3 of the 2007-2008 Call Book by adding the following:

Linking. 10,000 to 10,050 MHz and 10,400 to 10,450 MHz.

DayBreakerR Rally 2008

Hi everyone.

The DayBreaker® Rally Organising Committee met on Wednesday 12 March 2008 which I attended. AREC has once again been asked to provide radio communications for Start, Finish and Mid-point tracking. AREC will also be operating within the Rally HQ. Tararua District Radio Club Incorporated Branch 06 has again been confirmed as the host club for organising amateur radio communications throughout the course this year.

The date for the DayBreaker® Rally has been confirmed for Saturday 11 October 2008 and will follow the same course as last year covering roads within the Tararua and Manawatu Districts with a full day of rallying thrills and spills.

This year's Rally will be significant in that it attracts four special events:

- 1. 2008 will see the DayBreaker® Rally celebrate 25 years;
- 2. 2008 DayBreaker® Rally will be the final round of the Rally Extreme® Championship;

- 3. 2008 DayBreaker® Rally will be the final round of the North Island Rally® Series;
- 4. 2008 Tararua District Radio Club Incorporated celebrates 80 years of service to the community.

An early invitation is extended to operators interested in being part of this year's Rally so mark the date on your calendars now.

What you will need: A mobile VHF or UHF or a dual band radio fitted into your vehicle with appropriate antennae. You will need to advise me which you have so that you can be placed at the appropriate location for your radio. If your radio is at the doctors but you are still interested in taking part please let me know so that we can try and organise something for you.

A Radio Operators Rally Manual will be sent out to those involved in the Rally again this year and are mostly complete but am awaiting confirmation on a couple of items from the DayBreaker® Rally Committee including a new and updated course map. While it is envisaged that we will use the same frequencies as last year, the use of both fixed and STSP repeaters have not yet been confirmed.

As with past years, reimbursements will be available again this year for those operators who are registered and involved within the Rally at the designated radio points. The DayBreaker® Rally Committee have reiterated that reimbursements will only be available for those operators registered with the Rally and involved on the day, funding constraints DO NOT ALLOW for reimbursements for pre-Rally activities.

PLEASE NOTE: It is a requirement of the DayBreaker® Rally Safety Plan that ALL participants [including radio operators] involved within the Rally are registered for the event. As one of the confirmed officials for the DayBreaker® Rally, I will be collating the necessary information from operators involved on the day and submit this to the DayBreaker® Rally Committee for reimbursement approval. Registration of radio operators consists of your name and contact details which will be logged through myself to the Rally Committee.

A total of 30 operators are required for DayBreaker® Rally on Saturday 11 October 2008 so the earlier we can confirm a full complement, the sooner I will be able to advise the DayBreaker® Rally Committee if we can man all required radio locations or whether they will need to order more Fleetlink radios in.

Once again thank you to everyone who was involved with DayBreaker® 2007 and I look forward to hearing from those interested in this year's event.
