#### **ZL DXCC Card Checker**

The ARRL runs the DXCC awards program which you obtain awards in by submitting your QSL cards (or Logbook of the World credits) to the ARRL headquarters in the USA. A number of ZL's have applied for and obtained various levels of achievement including top of the Honour Roll for having worked all DXCC entities.

Several months ago it was suggested that New Zealand should have its own DXCC Card Checker rather than ZL's having to send QSL cards to the ARRL in the USA. After being nominated by my fellow ZL Dxer's NZART put forward my name to ARRL and the ARRL DXCC Manager has appointed me a DXCC card checker in this area of the world.

Basically my function is to receive and check cards to make sure they are valid for DXCC Applications and Total upgrades. Your cards will be checked and returned within a few days to you and I will sign the application and forward it to the ARRL DXCC Desk.

Please note: I do not and cannot award DXCC credits. The DXCC Desk does that. I simply check cards for information and validity. I cannot check "Deleted Entities" or 160M cards. They must be sent to the ARRL Desk for validation. I am bound by exactly the same rules as you would encounter with the DXCC desk.

If you are contemplating making a DXCC application in the near future, I would suggest that you contact me <a href="mailto:leejen@paradise.net.nz">leejen@paradise.net.nz</a> by email I can advise you and send you the correct forms and information to help you complete your application correctly. There are DXCC and return postage fees that must apply.

Australasia has never had a resident DXCC Card Checker and this is a great opportunity to become a DXCC member without risking your cards traveling to the USA. It is an honour and privilege to be able to be in a position to do this for ZL (and VK if required) amateurs.

# Square Kilometre Array - SKA (Radio is alive!)

The technical road to completing the \$2 billion Square Kilometre Array by 2020 has been discussed at a week-long conference - Deep Surveys of the Radio Universe with Square Kilometre Array Pathfinders - at The University of Western Australia.

WA and South Africa have been short listed as the two best sites on which to build a giant radio telescope linked by supercomputers and thousands of small antenna dishes arranged in spiral-shaped clusters spread across the country.

The conference featured research by Australian and international astronomers on SKA-related science projects including WA's \$100 million SKA pathfinder project being built by CSIRO at the proposed SKA site at Boolardy station 300km north-east of Geraldton.
