FMTAG Notes For October 2008

At its 4th November meeting, NZART Council approved publication of the following FMTAG notes.

APRS FREQUENCY CHANGE

Two of this month's applications request a change of frequency for APRS digipeaters, from the 144.575 MHz APRS frequency to the digipeater common frequency of 144.650 MHz. This means that, if the changes are approved, the APRS traffic will also be carried by the other stations on the digipeater common channel of 144.650 MHz. INTERIM RECOMMENDATIONS TO NZART COUNCIL

Published for the information of, and seeking comments from, NZART members.

Branch 05 Christchurch Amateur Radio Club has applied to modify its 144.575 MHz digipeater as follows: change the frequency to 144.650 MHz, increase the output power, and change the licensed location to NZ260 M36 804330. An engineering investigation confirms that there will be no interference to co-located and near-sited stations.

Branch 13 Hastings-Havelock North has applied for an APRS 465 digipeater, to be located at Taraponui, at map reference NZ260 V19 333234. The transmit and receive frequency will be 144.650 MHz. An engineering evaluation confirms that there will be no interference to co-located and near-sited stations. This application replaces the Interim Recommendation published in March/April 2008 Break-In and the Final Recommendation published in May/June 2008 Break-In.

Branch 22 Marlborough has applied to move its 465 Digipeater at Kaikoura to map reference NZ260 O31 673650. An engineering evaluation confirms that there will be no interference to other stations, and that the Digipeater can remain on 144.650 MHz.

Branch 39 Tauranga has applied to move its 4625 Digipeater to Mt Minden, located at map reference NZ260 U14 794833. An engineering evaluation confirms that there will be no interference to other stations, and that the Digipeater can remain on 144.625 MHz.

Branch 55 Waitomo has applied to move its 7225 Repeater to Puahue Road, located at map reference NZ260 S15 175509. An engineering evaluation confirms that there will be no interference to other stations, and that the repeater transmit frequency can remain on 147.225 MHz, with a receive frequency of 147.825 MHz.

FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS TO NZART COUNCIL

Published as an Interim Recommendation in September/October 2008 Break-In. No objections have been received.

Branch 74 Wellington VHF has applied to relocate its 880 repeater to Colonial Knob, map reference NZ260 R27 613043. An engineering evaluation confirms that there will be no interference to other stations, and that the repeater transmit frequency can remain on 928.800 MHz with a receive frequency of 921.200 MHz.

Database Of Nets

Jock White Field Day February 28 and 1st March 2009

Please note the change of date for 2009, the reasons for this are below.

This is a great event which can be as serious or as social as you like. It is an ideal activity to bring people in your branch/club together. Operating begins at 1500 local on the Saturday, runs through to 2400, restarts at 0600 on the Sunday finishing at 1500, on 80 and 40 metres. There are many sections to choose from (although only one can be entered by each station) the rules mentioned above have all the details, please consult them.

Change of Field Day date for 2009

The last full weekend in February 2009 (21st and 22nd) clashes with the ARRL international CW contest. After careful consideration John Powell and I have decided to shift Field Day back one week to the following weekend 28th and 1st March.

I realise that this change may cause inconvenience to some participants but we felt that the change was necessary for the following two reasons:

Firstly, if Field Day was on the same weekend there would be many DX stations ready to pounce on ZLs calling CQ. The bulk of these DX stations will be outside of VK and the South Pacific and are not eligible for scoring for Field Day. As many Field Day CW operators are only occasional contesters, trying to 'fend off' these stations could be a major inconvenience.

Second, there are a significant number of Field Day operators that routinely participate in the ARRL contest, the shift in date avoids a conflict here.

Addition to Field Day Rules

I have added a new rule concerning the operating standards of stations participating in Field day. If the Field Day manager receives reliable reports that a Field or Home was being operated in a way that interfered with other stations, the interfering station may be disqualified.

I have added this rule in response to multiple reports of severe QRM from stations causing splatter in recent years. The Field Day rules on the NZART web site will be changed shortly to include this rule.

It is essential that transceivers are operated correctly during Field Day. A common problem is a different microphone being used during the contest with a higher audio output. If the microphone gain is not turned down to allow for a higher output then splatter can occur due to the transmitter being overloaded. Please check the ALC readings prior to the start of the contest, consult the transceiver manual if necessary. Once the microphone gain has been set leave it alone. Remember that far more points are scored through good operating technique rather than trying to squeeze another 10 or 20 watts from your transmitter (which no one will notice anyway!).

My appreciation to those who identified the likely clash of contests.

By all accounts conditions were not too bad for the Straight Key Night Activity last Sunday evening. Not now having an antenna system at this QTH is proving somewhat limiting - I have about 50 feet of wire tracking through the drape supports in the lounge and feeding a R1000 receiver. 2009 JOCK WHITE FIELD DAY CONTEST - REVISED DATES 28 FEBRUARY 2009 AND 1 MARCH 2009

Because of the likely problems with both events running at the same time it has been decided to put back a week the running of the Field Day contest.
