# FMTAG NOTES FOR HQ INFO LINE 250

#### NZART COUNCIL REVISES ITS LICENCE FEE POLICY

As mentioned in "From the President" (page 3 March/April Break-In), NZART Council has revised its Beacon, Link and Repeater Licence Fee Policy. Here are more details.

Council resolved to encourage the transfer of Repeater, Beacon and Link Licences from NZART to the equipment-owning Branches, and to impose a surcharge of \$5.11 per licence, to offset NZART HQ costs, on those licences that remain with NZART.

The MED's Annual Administration Fee, for an Amateur Beacon, Link, or Repeater Licence, is \$46.00, if paid by credit card via the MED's SMART website, or \$51.11, if paid by cheque to the MED's Business Service Centre. The \$5.11 surcharge recognises the cost to the MED of processing a manual payment.

Previously, NZART HQ requested payment of \$46.00 from Branches and forwarded the full amount to the MED.

The NZART HQ cost of processing a manual payment are similar to those of the MED and, therefore, NZART Council decided to introduce the same \$5.11 surcharge per licence for all Licence Fee payments made via NZART HQ.

#### FINAL RECOMMENDATION TO NZART COUNCIL

NZART Council, at its 1st of May meeting, approved the following Final Recommendation, which can now proceed to licensing.

Branch 74 Wellington VHF has applied for an APRS Digipeater at Kaiwharawhara Hill, located at TOPO50 BQ31 494.93 316.03. The transmit and receive frequency will be 144.575 MHz in accordance with the band plan. An engineering investigation, in accordance with MED PIB38, confirms that there will be no interference to other stations.

# 12<sup>th</sup> USA ARDF Championships

Registrations are now being accepted for the Twelfth USA ARDF Championships, which will take place in the forests near Mt. Laguna Village, about 45 miles east of San Diego, California.

Activities will get under way on Wednesday and Thursday, May 30 - 31, when an optional two-day "training camp" will take place. The official championships opening will take place on Friday, June 1 with practice and equipment testing sessions. The two-meter contest will take place on Saturday, June 2, after which all will gather for a banquet in the evening. Sunday's schedule includes the 80-meter contest and an awards ceremony, timed to end in mid-afternoon to accommodate those who must hurry home.

The official event Web page at www.homingin.com has the registration form. It is important for participants to register right away. The organizers need an accurate head count and assurances that there will be sufficient attendees. It's also important to make reservations now if you want to stay at the event headquarters, which is Laguna Mountain Lodge. (Nearby camping is also available.)

Transportation and lodging information is on the event Web page, as well as the daily schedule, competition rules, transmitter and map information. For questions and regular updates, you can subscribe to a group mailing list for participants and others interested in

these championships.
