#### **Waro Award**

- 1. This Award will run from the 19<sup>th</sup> to the 26<sup>th</sup> of August 2017 (Inclusive.)
- 2. This award is open to all amateurs, OMs and YL's
- 3. Contacts may be made on 2m, 70cm, 80m. Phone or CW.
- a. A bonus station ZL6YL, will need to be worked and can be claimed as 5 points.
- b. Other points will be as follows. A member of the WARO Executive 4 points.
- c. WARO member 3 points.
- d. An OM who is a paid up "Friend of WARO" 3 points.
- e. A YL who is a non member of WARO 1 point.

All these points are for initial contacts only. These stations may all be worked on separate days on other bands and occasions and can count towards the award but will only be worth 1 point thereafter.

- 4. Total needed for the award in ZL 20 points, VKs 10 points.
- 5. Paper logs and/or Electronic logs to be sent to either The Award Custodian ZL1LL Lynnette McDonald, 25 John Street, Pukekohe 2120

- 6. Logs must include your full name, call-sign, address and be signed. It must also include points claimed. On Electronic logs the email address at the top of the message header will be counted as a signature.
- 7. All logs must be clear. No logs will be returned. The Decision of the Awards Manager is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 8. All logs must contain: Date, Time, Contact, Call sign, Signals Sent and Received, Frequency worked, Name of operator, Category of points to be claimed, (eg friend of WARO. Non WARO YL). Points claimed.
- 9. All logs to be received before the 26<sup>th</sup> September.

## Welland Valley Amateur Radio Society "Lest we forget"

In 2016, one of our members Paul G1FJH, decided to research one of his relatives (Harry) who had lost his life in the trenches of the First World War. During his search, he turned up British Army Records including the Regimental Diary which detailed what happened on the day of the battle which took Harry's life. He also managed to obtain copies of the German Hospital records of which gave details of his injuries and the eventual cause of death. He was also able to locate the grave site at which he was buried. This prompted a field trip to the Somme, France, to see for himself what the battlefield looks like today.

In June 2017 Paul gave a very moving talk to club members on what he had discovered on his search, and with the help of a Power Point presentation containing images from 1918 next to images taken recently, he managed to bring the horrors of the great war to life. He also put a number of items he had discovered while walking the battlefield that had been brought to the surface by recent ploughing. This is known as the iron harvest. Some of the tens of thousands of used and live rounds, empty bullet cases, buckles, shrapnel and shell parts that still litter the area 100 years after the final battle.

Following the talk members of the club decided to put on a series of special event stations in 2018 to mark the end of the War to end all wars, and in remembrance of the 18 Millin who lost their lives and the 24 million injured on all sides. A total of 12 special call signs have been applied for and will be put on air during the year.

# **New Radio Spectrum License Fees**

RSM has announced that changes to the fees regime will take effect from 1 October. Below is a short paragraph that you may wish to pass on to your members, through a newsletter or on your website. New radio spectrum licence fees from October

Radio Spectrum Management today announced that the date its simplified fee regime will take effect is 1 October 2017.

Most commercial and amateur licence users won't need to do anything for the move to the new fee structure. Licensees will automatically be moved into one of the four new fee categories and see this change reflected on invoices and the Register of Radio Frequencies.

A letter will be sent to those land mobile licensees holding multiple transmitter location licences to confirm which fee class will apply to their licence.
