I have recently had a few enquiries from some very long-standing members as to the length of service they have as NZART members. Regrettably back when records first began and membership certificates issued, a date was never placed on the original certificate.

However, my predecessors did assign a number for each new member, in 1981 when records were computerised, this number was replaced with a new one, which correlated to the length of service for each member and with the original number.

I still have the list of old numbers issued to these people right up until 1981, when the computer programme generated a new number. I am satisfied that the old and new numbers are sequentially allocated corresponding to the time of membership to NZART.

While many of you may have been licensed in the early 1950's it was not a requirement then to have been a member of the Association, but a matter of choice.

Removal of Branch Rebate on New Members

At the 1 October 2019 meeting of the NZART Executive Council it was agreed that the Branch Rebate on new members be rescinded, as of 1 October 2019.

This rebate system had been in operation since 2010 but was poorly subscribed to by the branches of the association.

In order to simplify the membership process and to fund the new Student ZERO Fee's Policy the decision was made to remove this rebate.

Expressions of Interest: DATV - Channel 25

With the growth of Digital Television in New Zealand (DTV), Amateurs

lost the use of Channel 39 in the UHF DTV band. This had a major impact on activity so a search for alternative spectrum was begun. Digital TV Channel 25 is the guard band between the Emergency Service C Band and the lower end of the DTV band at around 500 MHZ and was identified as a candidate.

A NZART Branch took on the role to progress testing and building of a DATV Repeater in this guard band. After several years this progress has become too slow, or non-existent to the satisfaction

of NZART Council, by the branch concerned.

NZART is therefore seeking expressions of interest from other clubs or branches to progress this project

to a conclusion. We are seeking a project that can be delivered over an eighteen-month period from its

start date. A high-level project plan must be submitted with measurable milestones spaced no more than six

months apart. These six-monthly high-level milestones must be agreed to, and met or the project, after

review may be stopped. NZART is not looking to pressure any group in doing this work but it cannot

continue for many years without progress.

If your club or branch is interested in undertaking this project, contact Debby at NZART via email

<nzart@nzart.org.nz> expressing your interest. Once all expressions have been received a
decision will be

made no later than 6 November 2019. The successful club or branch will then be contacted to provide a more

detailed project plan. Once this plan is approved by NZART Council, a commencement date will be agreed

to have this project delivered.
