ELG Report

Warren Harris ZL2AJ has applied for a:

FM voice repeater at Mt.Tahua, Topo50 BG34 120.67 043.81. The TX frequency will be 147.325 MHz.

433.475 MHz TX, FM voice, link at Mt. Tahua to the New Plymouth 438.475 MHz repeater.

APRS repeater at Te Rauamoa, Pirongia. Topo50 BE33 802.22 873.66. The frequency will be 432.775 MHz.

APRS repeater at Pukawa 2 Topo50 BH35 368.83 872.55. The frequency will be 144.575 MHz. (External ARC152)

NZART Te Puke branch have applied for an APRS repeater. The APRS will be located at the same location 194 Totara Street of the existing 144.800 MHz licence which is no longer used. The frequency will be 144.575 MHz (External ARC117)

Tauranga districts ARC will be adding a ULS at the Minden Amateur site on 433.550 MHz. This will link Tauranga 680 to Te Puke 7175 via 885. (External ARC117)
