


"On the Radar"

The amateur radio fraternity has been generously gifted several brand-new copies of a book entitled, "On the Radar". They are cellophane wrapped as delivered from the printer. The book addresses in spectacular detail the establishment, staffing,

operation and decommissioning of the World War 2 radar station which was sited north of Piha on the west coast of the North Island.

Thirteen Chain Overseas Low (COL) radar stations were operated by the RNZN around New Zealand's coast from 1941 onwards, specifically to provide early



warning of the approach of unidentified ships or aircraft, the Imperial Japanese armed forces being the foremost threat in Defence Department minds.

The author, Sandra Coney, has thoroughly researched her topic, interviewed several radar engineers who installed equipment and maintained the station during its years of operation, including the venerable lan Sexton,

ZL1PZ. She has written a most informative, complete, and easily understood narrative to complement the collection of historic photographs.

The book retails for \$40 plus post, however clubs or individuals wanting a copy will pay only \$7.50 post, or free to collect from Levin. If interested please contact Stan, zl3tk.radio@gmail.com

DN Calling award

To celebrate the centenary of Radio Broadcasting in New Zealand, Otago Branch 30 will be running the "DN Calling Award" during the month of November 2021. To qualify for the award applicants, need to earn 10 points (or more). Points are gained from contacts during November with stations as follows:

Special station ZL100DN - 5 points Branch 30 Club Station ZL4AA - 3 points Members of Branch 30 - 1 point

Branch 30 stations and the above callsigns should be active most nights during November on 3610 kHz +/- QRM. However, contacts on any band and mode are permitted for the award.

Contacts with each callsign can only be claimed once during the month. Repeat contacts do not count for points regardless of band, mode, or day.

Radio Spectrum Management reports...

Applying for a Licence to Supply Radio Transmitters and your obligations

Every person wanting to supply radio transmitters in NZ must apply for a Licence to Supply Radio Transmitters, either as an individual or organisation. A supplier is any person in NZ who imports, manufactures, distributes, sells, or installs electrical, electronic or radio products to the market.


If the supplier also wants to supply unrestricted two-way radios described under the Prohibition Notice "Unrestricted two-way radio notice 2018", they must also apply to become a permitted person. Applying for a Licence to Supply and a permitted person is a two-step process. Please note that unrestricted radios can only be sold to qualified radio amateurs.

A permitted person will be obligated to follow the additional terms, conditions and restrictions outlined in their Licence to Supply. Permitted persons will be audited periodically for compliance with the licence. Failing to comply with the conditions of the licence may result in enforcement action.
