## VHF / UHF Field Day Contest 2021



The annual VHF UHF Field Day Contest is scheduled for the first weekend in December – this year that's the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> of December.

Although it's called a "Field Day", this does not prevent home stations from taking part.

If you haven't taken part for some time, how about dusting off the rig and set aside some time to have a go. Most operation will be on 2m and 70cm and the frequencies to listen and call on are 144.2 MHz, 432.2 MHz If you've also got 6m, then the calling frequency is 50.15 MHz on 1296 MHz, look for stations on 1296.2 MHz Most SSB operation uses horizontally polarized antennas. If you are operating from a home station, and only have a vertically polarised antenna, still give it a go! The contest starts at 1700 NZDT on Saturday 4 December and finishes at 2300 NZDT. On Sunday the 5<sup>th</sup>, activity gets underway again at 0700, but if that's a bit early for you, just join in when you can on Sunday and the contest finishes at 1300. On both days the contest is divided up into one-hour periods, so starting at 1700 on Saturday, the first period is 1700 to 1800 NZDT. The aim is to work as many stations as possible during each hour but no repeat contacts on the same band please. You can work them again in the next hour and so on right through the contest.
