60m Sub Licence

As announced in the last InfoLine NZART has obtained from RSM, a new 60m licence with the same terms and conditions as the previous licence which expires on 4 May 2022. This allows time for RSM to promulgate a new GURL.

If you have an existing 60m sub-licence then it will continue to apply under the new licence and you can continue operate on 60m as you did before. No need to reapply.

If you are a new user to 60 m then you must first apply for a sub-licence by completing the application found on the NZART website here: https://www.nzart.org.nz/info/60m and forward to NZART HQ for sign off and subsequent listing on the website of users.

8 WPM ZONE

There seems a huge gap between learning to copy Morse and actually operating on air. It is a time when we need to practice at a speed we can copy while we build confidence and skill in our new pastime. This is the zone somewhere between 8 and 13 wpm. If we cannot find success here, we are unlikely to continue.

To help close this gap I am starting an 8 WPM ZONE. We will use 3.545 MHz each Wednesday at 8 PM for this zone. It would be a one-topic net. The topic for the first session would be 'TODAY?'

- Net control begins at 8 WPM CQ 8 WPM ZONE DE ZL1PX K
- 2. Members give calls at 8 WPM ZL1BOX, ZL2BOX, ZL3BOX,
- 3. Net control prompts each caller in turn to send something at 8WPM. ZL1BOX DE ZL1PX TODAY? K

- 4. First caller responds at 8 WPM DE ZL1BOX TODAY I WENT SHOPPING FOR FOOD FOR MY BOA CONSTRICTOR K
- 5. Net control responds and invites next caller THANKS ZL1BOX ZL2BOX DE ZL1PX TODAY? K

The emphasis is on keeping to one speed that all can copy while we build our skills. We would want our offerings to be simple to start with – maybe not more than a dozen words. We change net controller and topic each week. Tune in if interested. 8 WPM ZONE runs April and May.

Sangster Shield Contest - May 2022

The 2022 NZART Sangster Shield Contest is to be held Saturday 21st & Sunday 22nd May 2000 – 2300hrs NZST each evening.

Rules for this year are unchanged since those published in the 2016 April/May Break In and as per the NZART website:-

Contest is 80 metres CW only for entrants with power <u>output</u> up to 5 watts pep.

Note that the Transistor Trophy entry criteria allows first time Sangster contestants to enter, rather than just newly licensed operators.

Reminding that the Exchange (Cipher) is RST, Contact serial number beginning at 001 & Branch number. Power output is <u>not to be given</u> on air but will be published in results.

CW beginners have commented that their preferred exchange is – RST / Serial number / Branch number (where / = dah-di-di-dah-dit).

Remember that there are 6 <u>HALF</u> hour operating periods <u>EACH</u> evening. 12 periods in total

Use the Branch Number of your location regardless of whether this is currently active or in recess.

If you are going to work from different locations each night – experience has shown it is easier for all if you just choose one Branch number & stick to it.

Operating just one night is also fine as we would all prefer to have as many on the air as possible.
